Nashdale Public School Behaviour Support and Management Plan


Overview

Nashdale Public School is committed to explicitly teaching and modelling positive behaviour and to supporting all students to be engaged with their learning. Key programs prioritised and valued by the school community are Positive Behaviour for Learning and The Resilience Project.

Promoting and reinforcing positive student behaviour and school-wide expectations

Nashdale Public School has the following school-wide rules and expectations:

• to be Ripe for Learning (Respect, Integrity, Pride, Engagement)







Nashdale Public School uses the following strategies and systems to explicitly teach, recognise and reinforce positive student behaviour and behavioural expectations:

- Merit Award System
- House Point System House points are used by all staff to reinforce positive behaviour for students that demonstrate the school values of Respect, Responsibility and Resilience. Students are also awarded house points for demonstrating community mindedness and citizenship. House points are recorded in all classrooms and tallied weekly. The updated weekly tally is shared at the Monday morning assembly. Assembly awards given throughout the term to students in the House with the most points. At the end of year Presentation Night, the House Shield presented at to the House which has earned the most house points during the year.


